OVERVIEW

This position will work with our event coordinators during our *Winterlights* exhibit. Opening in November 2019, *Winterlights* will feature a dazzling nighttime experience with a magical stroll through The Garden illuminated by over one million lights.

Primary Responsibilities:

The following responsibilities describe the general nature of work for employees in this position, but this is not intended as an exclusive or all-inclusive inventory.

- Act as onsite coordinator for internal and external events as needed
- Set-up & tear down internal and external events as needed
- Assist in the communication of event details with the operation departments of the Newfields
- Administrative duties for events and hospitality department such as invoicing, contracting, following up with leads, drafting proposals and completing internal paperwork/forms as needed
- Work with the onsite Newfields staff and outside vendors to ensure exceptional event experiences during execution of internal and external events
- Provide support to the hospitality and events team in the onsite planning, set up and execution of events, internal and external, as needed
- Assist as needed to culinary arts team projects

- Basic knowledge of special events including weddings, non-profit organization, & corporate
