# **Newfields cancels 2020 Summer Nights Film Series**

**INDIANAPOLIS**, May 22, 2020— In light of the guidelines required by local and State Government officials due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak and for the safety of our staff and guests, Newfields has made the decision to cancel The National Bank of Indianapolis Summer Nights Film Series. This cancellation extends to all Newfields regular remaining programs through 2020.

This decision has been made to ensure Newfields can focus on the planning of a safe campus re-opening in phases, the rescheduling of the highly anticipated <u>Edward Hopper and the American Hotel</u>, and the planning for upcoming large-scale seasonal festivals, such as <u>Harvest</u> and <u>Winterlights</u>.

"This decision was very difficult to make," said Charles L. Venable, The Melvin & Bren Simon Director and CEO. "But the safety of our guests and staff is of the utmost importance during this pandemic and it would be impossible to properly practice social distancing in our amphitheater without totally changing the community-nature of this popular event. The same is true for many other programs, so we have decided simply to take a pause for the rest of 2020 on most of them. The upside to simplifying Newfields' schedule, is that we can focus more closely on our largest events that we host in the fall and early winter to ensure the public's safety and enjoyment."

In response to Governor Holcomb's five stage roadmap to safely re-open Indiana and the recent Marion County Public Health Order, Newfields will continue its temporary campus closure. Newfields is closely monitoring the developments of the global outbreak and following all updates from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the World Health Organization (WHO). Newfields looks forward to re-opening the campus in phases when State and local officials deem it is safe to do so.
