## Art in Bloom presented by Fifth Third Private Bank returns 3/31 through 4/3

The second annual event returns with show stopping floral arrangements created by 26 artists

INDIANAPOLIS, March 10, 2022— Art in Bloom presented by Fifth Third Private Bank will return to the Indianapolis Museum of Art (IMA) at Newfields Thursday, March 31 through Sunday, April 3. During this second annual weekend event guests can see art and nature collide with spectacular floral arrangements in the IMA Galleries.

Each arrangement is inspired by an artwork in the IMA permanent collection and designed by talented local and regional florists and floral designers. The show will include five monumental showstoppers, including one in the newly reopened Clowes Pavilion, and 21

pedestal designs, all sure to captivate guests with green and brown thumbs alike.

The event will kick off with the Art in Bloom Opening Reception sponsored by Fifth Third Private Bank on Wednesday, March 30. This event will provide guests with a sneak preview of Art in Bloom as well as a wine portfolio show hosted by the Newfields Culinary team and Republic National Distributing Company. Guests will be able to interact with the floral artists while sampling a variety of wines throughout the IMA Galleries. Tickets to this event are \$80 for public and \$75 for members. This year Art in Bloom will feature a robust schedule of activities for guests to enjoy. Live music, artist demonstrations and <u>ASK ME! Docents</u> will happen throughout the weekend. Other activities such as <u>art classes</u>, a film screening of <u>MIDSOMMAR (rated R)</u> and <u>orchid classes</u> require a separate ticket that can be purchased in advance. The Opening Reception, art Classes and the *MIDSOMMAR* (rated R) film screening all require additional tickets and do not include general admission to Art in Bloom. Orchid classes also require an advance ticket but general admission to Art in Bloom is included.

Access Pass tickets are available for \$2 for qualifying pass holders and Newfields will be distributing 1,500 tickets over the weekend to community partners.
