Born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio, Dr. Pierce Burnette is a mother, a wife, an engineer, a lover of music, dogs, books, and champagne. She received her high school diploma in Cleveland, Ohio, from John F. Kennedy High School, a Bachelor of Science in Engineering from The Ohio State University, and a Master of Science in Administration from Georgia College. She is a graduate of the Harvard Graduate School of Education's Management Development Program and received her Ed.D. in Higher Education Administration from the University of Pennsylvania. She is married to retired Air Force Lieutenant Colonel Dr. Daarel Burnette, and they have two adult children, Daarel II and Daana.
