All-Starry Night hosted by Amp Harris Productions & George Hill 2/17 With special quest Grammy award-winning rapper Common. Tickets on sale now.



INDIANAPOLIS, February 9, 2024–Known for its host-city expertise, Indianapolis is set to show the NBA world what the Circle City has to offer. Fifteen-year NBA veteran George Hill, synonymous with basketball in Indianapolis, and Amp Harris are partnering with Newfields to host <u>All-Starry Night presented by Uncle Nearest Premium Whiskey</u> on Saturday, Feb. 17. The fun-formal occasion, taking place in *THE LUME Indianapolis*, serves as the red-carpet event to celebrate 2024 All-Star Saturday Night.

"Being from Indianapolis, growing up here, playing basketball from a kid to an adult, this is special to me. I wanted to be a part of something really exciting for our city during All-Star Weekend," stated George Hill. "Amp and I knew that Newfields would offer that amazing atmosphere and feel for this type of international event. Special guest and Grammy award-winning rapper, Common will set the tone for a slam-dunk of an evening. The night will feature an open bar with a signature cocktail from Uncle Nearest and light hors d'oeuvres from Newfields' Chef Patrick Russ. Local talent including DJ Lady Locs and The Trap Orchestra will be joined by Chicago-based DJ Vince Adams and renowned saxophonist from Los Angeles Bryan Thompson to deliver performances that will keep the dance floor full the entire night.

All-Starry Night is set for Saturday, Feb. 17, and all tickets are general admission. There is no tiered ticketing for this event. Doors will open at 9 p.m., last call will be at 12:30 a.m., and the party will conclude at 1 a.m.

Advance tickets are required. Members can purchase tickets for \$175, and public tickets are available for purchase at \$185.
