The spring season marks the opening of Lilly House and the Madeline F. Elder Greenhouse. Additionally, there are two Free First Thursdays throughout *Spring Blooms*: April 4 and May 2.

The Beer Garden at Garden Terrace offers a curated beer, wine and cider menu designed by Newfields' Certified Cicerone Lindsay Jo Whirley featuring best-in-style beers from Germany, Belgium and right here in Indianapolis. Complimentary to the drinks, the food menu from Newfields Executive Chef Patrick Russ offers seasonally curated items such as sandwiches, salads and sausages alongside favorites like the Giant Bavarian pretzel with house-made cheese. Non-alcoholic offerings include the lemonade and berries, orchid green tea, nitro cold brew coffee and craft root beer.

Looking for a Mother's Day experience? Saturday, May 11 and Sunday, May 12, live music, lawn games, brunch specials and more will be available for all as *Spring Blooms* nears the end of its run. This weekend of love and creativity is perfect for the special mother figures in our community.
